



Greater Green Bay foundation awards \$89,000 in grants

The Greater Green Bay Community Foundation recently awarded more than \$89,000 to 14 Northeastern Wisconsin nonprofit agencies and programs through its Funds for Greater Green Bay.

The newest program on the grant roster is the Bellin Foundation's Kidshape/Teenshape program, which received \$6,300. The program aims to reduce obesity by helping children increase their physical activity and improve their eating habits and self-esteem. The grant subsidized a sliding fee scale to make the program accessible to all.

Other grants are:

- \$5,184 to Literacy Green Bay to cover the cost of teaching salaries so the literacy program can offer adult English Language Learner classes.
- Two grants totaling \$18,000 to support the Lakeland Chapter of the American Red Cross.
- \$2,000 to cover the costs of busing, equipment and field trips for the Ashwaubenon Special Children's Summer program
- \$2,500 to fund classes through the Junior Achievement program at Washington Middle School.
- \$7,700 to the New Community Shelter for the emergency shelter program.
- 3,280 to Service League of Green Bay Inc. for its Back-to School Store.
- \$1,000 to the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay for Camp Lloyd, a program for children working through the loss of a loved one.
- Two grants totaling \$7,250 to Family and Childcare Resources of Northeast Wisconsin: \$5,308 for child care for children of students in English language learning classes offered by Literacy Green Bay and at the Fort Howard Family Resource Center; \$1,942 for the general operation of the Fort Howard Family Resource Center.
- \$7,250 to support the general operations of the Howe Neighborhood Family Resource Center.
- \$800 to fund a field trip for fourth- and fifth-grade classes from Green Bay's Jefferson Elementary School.
- \$2,368 to the Door County YMCA for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated external defibrillator classes for senior citizens
- \$3,000 to the Family Centers of Door County Inc. to fund outreach activities to older adults on Washington Island.
- \$5,000 to Door County Memorial Hospital Ministry Health Care for the Ministry Fund program.
- \$7,900 to Shepherd of the Bay Lutheran Church in Ellison Bay for its Health and Wellness Ministry.
- \$10,000 to Unity Hospice and Palliative Care.
